International Exhibition Featuring Participants from 31 Nations, **Held Concurrently with Art Fair Tokyo 2019** Artists Nominated by Ambassadors from Asia, Oceania, Central and South America, **Europe, the Middle East, and Africa** A Showcase of Today's Global Art Scene, Presented in Tokyo

Art Tokyo Association will hold the international exhibition "World Art Tokyo" concurrently with Art Fair Tokyo 2019, featuring 31 artists from different nations selected from nominations by ambassadors in Japan.

"World Art Tokyo" was newly established at Art Fair Tokyo 2018 with the aim of providing a platform to showcase the work of artists emerging from diverse cultural backgrounds and global conditions. Following the inaugural edition at the previous fair that featured nine nations, this second version of the exhibition brings together up-and-coming artists from 31 countries. The theme of this edition, which is co-curated by two students majoring in arts studies and curatorial practices at the Tokyo University of the Arts Graduate School of Global Arts, is "Vibrant Planet—If the world is our vibration." As our world becomes increasingly complex and intertwined, the exhibition prompts visitors to re-consider history, geography, and identity, and then reverberates these "vibrations" from Tokyo out into the rest of the world.



World Art Tokyo: Vibrant Planet—If the world is our vibration

Today, when we can move easily across the globe, information is exchanged in real time worldwide, and we interact with other cultures on an everyday level, different cultures continually influence our lives while simultaneously enabling various forms of artistic expression. "World Art Tokyo: Vibrant Planet—If the world is our vibration" introduces artists from 31 nations whose hybrid work reveals the influence of other cultures. The exhibited artworks allow the viewer to sense vibrations of a symbiosis of national traditions (that is reverberations) and the influence of other cultures (that is, resonance). As our world becomes increasingly complex and intertwined, the exhibition prompts visitors to re-consider their own history, geography, and identity.
