Asian Art Award 2017 supported by Warehouse TERRADA Exhibition of 5 Finalists and Announcement of Grand Prize and Special Award

Asian Art Award 2017 supported by Warehouse TERRADA is a new contemporary art award, created by Art Tokyo Association in partnership with special sponsor Warehouse TERRADA. An exhibition of the work of the 5 finalists, during which the winners of the inaugural Grand Prize and Special Award will be decided, will be held from September 23rd to October 29th 2017, on the fourth floor of TERRADA ART COMPLEX in Tennozu, Tokyo.



The award aims to support emerging artists in Japan with exciting international future prospects. For this exhibition, the 5 finalists (Akihiko Taniguchi, Tomona Matsukawa, Takayuki Yamamoto, Chikako Yamashiro, and contact Gonzo) selected by 5 internationally minded curators will present new and recent work. During the exhibition, a jury of 7 leading figures from the Singapore, Chinese, and Japanese art worlds will select the winners of the Grand Prize and Special Award. The winners will be announced on September 27th.

The finalists' work will be judged according to its contemporary nature as well as the extendibility of its form and field, and its physicality. The jury will examine how deeply the work of the artists relates to the world today, the pursuit through the creative process of new potential for art in connection with other fields such as contemporary dance, new media art and cinema, and the quality of expression obtained through the artists' sense of the physical.

We look forward to welcoming visitors and members of the press to this exhibition exploring new possibilities for artistic expression to reflect the changes of the age.

Born in Saitama Prefecture in 1983 / Resides in Saitama Prefecture



Akihiko Taniguchi works in a variety of media, include sculpture, video, Internet art and new media art. Along with Tomoya Watanabe, he is a member of Omoide Yokocho Information Science Art Academy, an ephemeral and Art Informel community related to media art discovered at the Omoide Yokocho eating and drinking district in Shinjuku, Tokyo. His recent group exhibitions include "Open Space 2016" (NTT InterCommunication Center) and SeMA Biennale Mediacity Seoul 2016 (Seoul Museum of Art).

Tomona Matsukawa

Born in Aichi Prefecture in 1987 / Resides in Kyoto Prefecture



Tomona Matsukawa's paintings explore themes of contemporary vanity and solitude through traces of the things around us. Her major solo exhibitions include "Artist Meets Kurashiki Vol.12 Tomona Matsukawa" (Ohara Museum of Art, Okayama, 2016). Based on his experience as an elementary school teacher, Takayuki Yamamoto creates encounters with the unknown through workshops with children, critiquing the education system while searching for alternatives through art. In recent years he has conducted research in different areas with a focus on folklore, making work themed around the relationship between modern social systems and the individual. His exhibitions include the Kochi-Muziris Biennale (India, 2016–17) and "Constellations: Practices for Unseen Connections/Discoveries" (Museum of Contemporary Art Tokyo, 2015).

Chikako Yamashiro

Born in Okinawa in 1976 / Resides in Okinawa



Chikako Yamashiro uses both video and photography to create video work that explores the geopolitics of her native Okinawa. In recent years she has drawn on overseas narratives and history in order to develop her interpretation of the problems in Okinawa as not just a local issue, but a story of the weak being oppressed by the strong in the same way as can be seen all over the world. Recent exhibitions include "From Generation to Generation: Inherited Memory and Contemporary Art" (Contemporary Jewish Museum, USA, 2016–17) and the Aichi Triennale 2016 (former Meidi-ya Sakae Building).

contact Gonzo

Formed in Osaka Prefecture in 2006



Constructing an original pastoral theory of the sublime starting from physical collision, contact Gonzo creates improvisational performances, video, photography, and magazines. Its name derives from 1970s gonzo journalism and is also the name for its own methodology and practice. Current projects include firing various kinds of fruit at speeds of 100km/h at a body, "mountain surfing" down mountainous inclines, and creating video games with digital materials.
